According to reports, she had previously been involved in two serious road accidents, one of which left her suffering from epileptic fits.

Chavunduka was the SABC's first black female television news presenter on the broadcaster's main channel, then called TV1, and she was also active on radio, hosting a radio programme called The Alyce Chavunduka Show and also featured on Talk Radio 702 and 94.7 Highveld Stereo.
