

iWeek conference attracts international ISP meeting

Corporate IT and network executives, senior managers, strategists and product vendors can all add to their industry knowledge. At the same time, emerging ISPs and start-up Internet Cafés will find the wealth of contacts and exposure especially valuable for fast tracking their growth.
