Mark Zuckerberg announced on 27 June 2017 that Facebook has reached a new milestone: there are now two billion people connecting and building communities every month.



After someone reacts to a friend's post with love, wishes someone happy birthday, or creates a group, they will see a message in their News Feed thanking them.

"On <u>Good Adds Up</u>, we are featuring fun facts about how people are contributing to the community. In the US, we are also sharing stories of people who inspire us. Every day, people connect with one another, contribute to their local communities, and help make the world a better place.
