

Ford announces new vice president of operations

Ford Motor Company of Southern Africa (FMCSA) has appointed Ockert Berry as its Vice President of Operations effective 1 October 2013. Berry, replaces Peter Lawson, who will retire from FMCSA.

Berry joined FMCSA in 1991 as a Supervisor in the Paint Shop department and was responsible for training the workforce and providing guidance to the workers when required.
