

People power and the environment

In a bid to help save energy and protect the environment, Talk Radio 702 presenter Jenny Crwys-Williams earlier this week launched a campaign named 'Power to the People'. Businesses and residents are being urged to show their support for this campaign by switching off lights and non-essential equipment for one hour on Thursday, 23 August 2007, at 9pm.



Aimed at businesses in Gauteng, it challenges them to switch off unnecessary lights and other electrical equipment when no-one is occupying the buildings.

"The idea to launch a campaign like this came about when I saw just how much wasted energy is used by unoccupied buildings – it's a travesty for the environment," says Crwys-Williams.

"By getting as many businesses as possible to join in the switch off, it will show that energy conservation is child's play for everyone. I'm hoping the event will also gain support from Gauteng residents and hope they'll join in."

Eskom has also voiced its support, as well as 567 CapeTalk in Cape Town, which has called on Capetonians to join in the big switch off.
