

StreetSmart restaurateurs raise R1m for street children

StreetSmart restaurateurs and their diners raised a total of R1,050,000 last year to support street children and children at risk, by adding a voluntary R5 donation to each table's bill.

The Top 5 contributing restaurants are La Mouette (Cape Town), raising R73,095, The Saxon Hotel, Villas & Spa (Johannesburg), who raised R52,385.53, Taj Cape Town, raising R48,962.88, Savoy Cabbage (Cape Town), who raised R44,142.40, and Licorish Bistro (Johannesburg) who raised R35,960.
