## **1time partners with Greenpop to ensure a greener Africa**

O'Donnell adds that 1 time and Greenpop are in discussions to devise a project in which all the airline's passengers could be afforded the opportunity to offset their carbon footprint by having a tree planted on their behalf.

Komani concludes that 1 time is committed to finding other greening initiatives to partner with in the future.
