

HR as a business driver in focus at HR Summit and Expo Africa 2015

The strategic role of Human Resources in helping business thrive will be among the key issues to come under the spotlight at the upcoming HR Summit and Expo Africa 2015.

When asked about some of the top priorities in the field, 47% of survey respondents voted for making HR more strategic to the overall business, 42% of respondents cited developing future leaders and succession planning strategies for the sustainable growth and development of the business and 44% highlighted talent retention strategies.

Informa notes that now more than ever, HR has a crucial role to play as a strategic partner in overall organisational strategy and future business sustainability and growth. With a focus both on South Africa and pan-Africa, experts speaking at the event will address the continent's unique business and HR challenges.
