It begins with mindsets accepting and embracing perpetual change. Mindsets lead to newpractices, which are then amplified by technology. Leading to newcapabilities, which when applied, yield newresults - continuously and with increasing momentum.

ContinuousNext relates to culture; privacy; augmented intelligence, where humans and learning machines work together; as well as product management, as a discipline and Digital Twin.

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
