Francis Kéré, the award-winning architect from Burkina Faso has a humble mission to put his knowledge to good use and

help people in his native country through sustainable development. Kéré Architecture is seeking to create economic and ecological building solutions for local situations in a global context. The architect will share his continuing work towards promoting sustainable and community driven architecture, and the concept of development through architecture around the world. His office philosophy is building with the smallest energy footprint and reaping the utmost benefit for its users with a passionate focus on the usage and development of local materials and techniques.

Zimbabwean Architect **Michael Pearce** believes that architectural expression must construct a balance between the natural, social and economic environments in which a project is sited. Pearce will speak on his pioneering work on the concept of buildings that are drawn from nature and copying natural processes he has studied through the new science of bio-mimicry. He asserts that zero-carbon is no longer a dream but an attainable goal.

Convention activities

In addition to the plenary programme, the 2014 event is packed with two days of high energy keynote presentations, innovative exhibitions, panel discussions and will again see the presentation of the successful Brainwave Stage. The stage will host short, TED-like presentations by green building community members ranging from academics unveiling their innovative research to companies sharing their green building experience. This will all be enriched by a world-class exhibition created to encourage business to business opportunities, stimulate the green economy and inspire innovative industry practices.

The convention also offers optional pre-conference education days that present more detailed master classes, smaller group discussions and workshops facilitated by experts. In addition, the GBCSA will host a range of fascinating building tours of Green Star SA certified buildings such as Cape Town's beloved V&A Waterfront Precinct with its many sustainability initiatives; Silo 1, Silo 2 and future plans for the Clock Tower Precinct; and a Sustainable City Walking Tour culminating in one of the first opportunities to peek inside the brand new 5-star Green Star Portside Building.
