At the MPASA Sappi PICA Awards ceremony held at the Sandton Convention Centre in Johannesburg tonight, Thursday, 2 November 2006, Jenny Warwick, publisher of Crown Publications, was honoured as the fourth Print Media SA Fellow for 2006 for her dedicated contributions towards the PICAs.
