Airtel invests in Gabon's commercial and social programs

Airtel has committed to investing \$125 million in Gabon following discussions at the recent New York Forum in Libreville. The New York Forum Africa, was held in Libreville in collaboration with the government of Gabon. The over 600 business and political leaders that gathered together engaged in collaborative sessions to draw up a road map for individual businesses as well as national policy makers.

We are in Gabon for the long haul and will support both commercial and social programs. We plan to develop training programs on ICT business in collaboration with local training schools."

To underline the urgent need for integration of youth into the African growth strategy, it was reiterated that some 150 million young people were unemployed across the entire continent. Gabon aims to have a countrywide digital infrastructure by 2016, thus enabling the development of a wide range of e-services, which will give rise to a major qualitative improvement in social services and create the foundations for Gabon.

Coulibaly added, "The interactions at the forum were fruitful and we would like to extend our thanks to the organisers of the Forum and H.E. the president for the very informative, interactive and progressive sessions throughout the forum. We do look forward to realizing our commitments."
